





STEP 1: SET THE STAGE

Build on Phase I & Historical Reckoning to Identify Guiding Questions

- Embed reckoning, equity, and resiliency
- Identify guiding questions that will serve as framework for process

STEP 2: DEVELOP A POLICY TOOLKIT


